This group project has five components:

- 1. Facilitate a **community consultation** specific to the feasibility of a pickleball court in the Town of Lincoln. This will be held during class time on March 7<sup>th</sup>, at an off-campus location. Attendance at this is consultation is mandatory. <u>Step 1 is due on March 7<sup>th</sup> and is worth 5%.</u>
- Conduct a site visit/site analysis in the Town of Lincoln to determine options for installation of new courts or the conversion of existing spaces (e.g. unused basketball or tennis courts). Completion of a site analysis form required. Each group will have one site to visit. <u>Step 2 is due on March 21<sup>st</sup> and is worth 5%.</u>
- 3. Develop a **report** (see guidelines below) which incorporates information gained during step 1 & 2 as well as library work. A draft of the report (paper and electronic) is due March 28<sup>th</sup>. The final report (paper and electronic) is due April 8<sup>th</sup>.

Step 3 is due on April 8<sup>th</sup> and is worth 30%.

- 4. Presentation of report in a **Pecha Kucha** format during class time. <u>Step 4 is due on April 4<sup>th</sup> and is worth 2.5%.</u>
- 5. Peer evaluation. At the completion of the group project, all students will complete a peer evaluation of their group members. <u>Step 5 is due April 8<sup>th</sup> and is worth 2.5%.</u>

## Report Structure:

- This report needs to follow a report format discussed in lecture. This report is to be typed and should have at least 5 academic references. A table of contents, reference page, and a copy of the data gathered at the consultation are required.
- A draft of the report, in black and white (electronic & paper), in proper report format is due March 28<sup>th</sup>. The final report, in colour (electronic & paper), is due Tuesday, April 8<sup>th</sup> by 4pm.

## Report Components: - Use subheadings

- <u>Introduction</u>- overview of recreation planning and the benefits of recreation. Include a discussion on Canada's Recreation Framework (<u>https://www.cpra.ca/about-the framework/</u>) and the Town of Lincoln's Official plan (https://lincoln.ca/official-plan) (1 page)
- 2) <u>Methodology</u> Overview of what was done during consultation; literature related to the consultation step in the planning process (1 page). Discussion of raw data.
- 3) <u>Background</u> on the sport of pickleball and relevant equipment options: Use information on SAKAI, guest presentation by Sarah Ane on January 24<sup>th</sup>, and outside resources (Pickleball Canada: <u>https://www.pickleballcanada.org/</u> (1 page)
- 4) <u>Programming opportunities</u> on the sport of pickleball. Program development, leagues, hosting tournaments, etc. Make sure you incorporate the data you gathered during the consultation phase when proposing programming opportunities.
- 5) <u>Pricing pickleball</u> research and compare different pricing models (e.g. free vs. pay per use models). Make sure you incorporate the data you gathered during the consultation phase when proposing a pricing model.
- 6) Overall <u>best practices</u> of the sport of pickleball. Be sure to include a link or reference to each best practice discussed.
